Political direction & CAADP strategy

Use evidence and the Kampala framework to set direction and agree criteria for selecting priority implementation actions.

WEDNESDAY · 16 SEPTEMBER

Country readiness & REC delivery

Identify what is ready, blocked and needed. Member States identify 1–3 priority actions; RECs identify cross-border and regional priorities. A partner session matches needs to solutions.

THURSDAY · 17 SEPTEMBER

Implementation delivery labs

Work through the six Strategic Objectives. Each lab identifies actions, owners, domestic financing and budget routes, support needs and milestones.

FRIDAY · 18 SEPTEMBER

Investment, accountability & follow-up

Align investment pipelines and partner support; validate country compacts and confirm 30-, 90- and 180-day milestones through existing accountability systems.
